Somewhat extraordinarily we are still in the grip of the corona virus pandemic. This has been tempered by the excellent local roll out of vaccinations, but several of our villagers are still understandably anxious about catching the illness which can make one poorly even if fully vaccinated. Therefore, a continuation of the great community spirit and goodwill shown throughout the last 18 months will, we are sure, continue. This late summer edition of the newsletter contains important local issues and some of the important items raised at the Parish Council meetings which have now resumed in the village hall on the first Monday of each month at 7:30. Parishioners are very welcome and encouraged to attend but please let us know in advance by contacting the clerk, on the above email address, at least 24 hours prior to the meeting.

Neighbridge

Cotswold Lakes Trust have proposed several positive actions in the Spring to try and alleviate the problems that have been caused by the influx of visitors who sadly have created an increase of litter and some antisocial behaviour. The village and the Parish Council are dismayed by the number of cars parked each side of the road by the entrance to the somewhat underused fee-paying carpark which creep further into the village. None of the proposals have yet been implemented, but we hope this is just a matter of time. As a positive action parishioners can complete an incident report and forward it to the Parish Clerk to be collated and used to inform the appropriate bodies. As Cotswold Water Trust is a charity and have no funds to police or patrol the area, the community police and council are acutely aware of the problems. The Parish Council have attended the multiagency meetings scheduled at least twice yearly.

Village Lake

The Village Lake is a huge success and asset for the Village, and we are extremely grateful to Mike Wilding and his committee for their unceasing commitment to this project. Please

take time to take a stroll down to see all the care and effort and new projects carried out over the last 24 months.

The following is a list of some of the improvements on this ever-changing project :-

General cutting back and creation of 'Lake Vistas' to improve the aesthetics of the lake, and removal of as many obstacles to ease access for the majority of parishioners.

Calor £5000 grant has allowed a number of highlights such as the floating island, pond dipping platform, water gauge to check water levels, and an equipment shed.

Grant to fund bulb and wildflower section on the north side of the lake.

Dog Fouling

Dog fouling has been highlighted as an unpleasant and anti-social problem in the fields and footpaths around the village, many of us own dogs and we also have many visitors who walk along our footpaths. Parasites found in dog waste can cause abortion of calves and significant financial losses to the agricultural industry. They can also lead to human illness, particularly in children. Therefore, we encourage people to pick up waste and dispose of it properly in bins or at home.

Flooding

Somerford Keynes is always at risk of flooding and there are homes in Water Lane that have difficulty with drains every year. We are fortunate that the village has been spared major problems since the Thames Bund was installed. This is due for repair at present, but we would be grateful if any flooding incidents are formally reported either to district or county to ensure that we are on the radar for any help. The Government has promised very significant further funding for flood defences in this Parliament. There is a website "fix my street" which may facilitate reporting.

Village Hall

The Village Hall is once again open for business and has recently been painted and has upgraded WiFi. The Village Hall Committee is of course still conscious of the advice associated with indoor meetings and has instigated sensible covid measures meaning there is a maximum occupancy of 40, installed electronic hand sanitisers and has a new cleaning regimen. Playgroup

There is now an Under 5s playgroup in the village hall at 9:30am on Tuesday's. This is a great new addition for the village. Please do pop along for a hot drink and to meet other families, new and old, and for playing, singing, story time and crafting! £2 per family.
